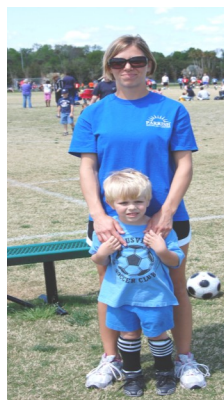

BACK TO THE FUTURE (SUBTITLED: THE GENERATION GAME)

Titusville Soccer Club is one of the oldest established clubs in BYSL and has been producing generation after generation of players and coaches with the regularity of a conveyor belt. There are players who have grown-up and learnt the game in Titusville and are now coaching their very own offspring. One of our younger coaches is Barbara Facemyer (Bobbi Fitts), aged 28 who started at TSC back in 1990 at age 8 and played at Astronaut High School from 1997-2000 and is now coaching her five year old son Logan on her Grey Wolves team. She has another young tyke by the name of Mason, who at aged three is eagerly awaiting his turn and the incredible thing is that their grandfather David Fitts, coached their mother Bobbi twenty years ago. Another is Jenny Evans (Aged 31), who coaches her four year old son Evan, who plays for the Sharks. Jenny started at TSC when she was 9 and played from 1988-1997 and at AHS from 1994-97 and still plays in the Adult 6v6 League in Canaveral Groves. Another one of our playing "moms" is Olivia Broom (formerly Evans), who played at TSC under the tutelage of former Head Coach Judge Dean Moxley in the 1980's and '90's and now coaches her daughter Aubrie in the U12 division. Jessica Vincent is a recent coach who's seven year old son Isaac plays at the club and is another example of someone who grew up at the old Dunn Air Park complex off Singleton Avenue; played throughout high school at THS and went on to receive a soccer scholarship at Tusculum College in Tennessee. Geoff Cone our Club Treasurer, at 41 is the club's oldest former player that is still coaching and he goes all the way back to the old AYSO (American Youth Soccer Organization), days when dinosaurs were spotted roaming off Singleton and studs (cleats), were pieces of wood, nailed into the bottom of the boot and rolled-up cardboard was used for shin-guards. He currently coaches both of his sons as his eldest Dustin plays on the U17 competitive team and his youngest Dalton plays competitively on the U13's. But, perhaps the grandmaster of them all is Jim Guppenberger, one of the club's early pioneers, who's grown boys played at the club and at THS and at 59, is now coaching his granddaughter Logan in the Girls U10 division. On behalf of the club I would like to personally thank all of you for stepping-up to coach, for giving something back from a game that has given us all so much, your unbridled passion and for continuing what can become a lifetime pursuit.
